'Annie 2' ends its workshop run

After bombing in Washington, D.C., "Annie 2" has been completely rewritten and has new songs and a new girl to play Annie and a new dog to play Sandy. The reworked musical has been in a workshop at the Goodspeed Opera House in Chester. Conn., and ends its run tonight.

"It should be called 'Annie 3' because

that's how much it is different from the play that opened in Washington," said producer

The cast includes Harve Presnell as Daddy Warbucks, Helen Gallagher as Mrs. Riley and Marian Seldes as Children's Commissioner Stark. The new Annie is Lauren Gaffney, 10, of Summit, N.J. The play went into workshop on May 17. Tom Meehan, who wrote the original story, has been making daily revisions along with Charles Strouse, who wrote the music, and lyricist Martin Charnin.

"We've got the play done over and now we'll have to wait for the sets, which are elaborate. to be made. That should be around October.' Allen said. Then "Annie 2" will play Boston, possibly Philadelphia and Florida, before coming to Broadway early next year.

These lyrics sung by Annie in <u>Annie 2</u> could very well be the theme song for the entire production! So many revisions, rearrangements, deletions, and additions occurred during the seven-week run at Goodspeed-At-Chester that it is almost impossible to list them all. What follows reflects the eight performances Jon and I saw; probably there were lots more changes we were not aware of. All in all, the production has improved tremendously and bears only a slight resemblance to the original <u>Annie 2</u>: <u>Miss Hannigan's Revenge</u>.

Act I begins with Annie having a nightmare: "Daddy" (later changed to a nameless woman) is bringing Annie back to the Orphanage saying he doesn't want her anymore, that he's "too busy." By the final performance, the "nightmare" theme was used in two other places later in the show to underscore Annie's feelings....Sandy performs a trick as he selects the red dress from a rack of Annie's dresses. Grace is no longer in the opening scene at all; it is Mrs. Pugh who helps Annie get dressed ("Ah, I see you're wearing that pretty red dress again. What a surprise.")....At Warbucks' office Miss Stark comes in and presents the court order that Warbucks must get married before Warbucks, Annie, and the staff sing WHEN YOU SMILE ... For a while CHANGES was moved to Scene 3 (The Orphanage Playroom) but it was moved back to Scene 2.... Two more prospective wife candidates suggested by Miss Stark appear: Roberta Parnell ("who has a barely noticeable little tic in her left eye") who goes to lunch with Warbucks and Annie, and Amanda Van Cleef (later Amanda Beekman) who is a total snob and is in the movie house scene....Other possibilities are mentioned also, including "Dr. Patricia Tozzi, a practicing Larchmont pediatrician for the past 27 years"The "Leapin' lizards, ain't life something" beginning was put back into CHANGES Annie is no longer bringing presents to the Orphans; she has come to "talk to somebody my own size"....Orphan Peaches is shown reading True Detective magazine and she wants to be a detective.... Kate Maguire's smoking is no longer mentioned....Fred and Gert Bixby and THE PERFECT KID have been cut; instead, the Orphans look over the picture files that Miss Stark has given Annie ("This lady's chin has 4 chins") and they decide that maybe if Annie gets an ugly mom it would be better than if the mother is beautiful ("At least a kid has a chance with her daddy if her mom looks like Rin-Tin-Tin, because if she's hot stuff, watch out"). The Orphans then sing a brand-new song called THE OTHER WOMAN ("She's got the curves/you're like an arrow/she slinks around in silk/candlelight dinners/she has martinis/you order chocolate milk")....Scene 4 (The Atrium of the Mansion) begins with Grace receiving the phone call from Steve McCall offering the job in Washington. Annie overhears this and when she asks Grace if she will leave, Grace replies, "To your father I'm just the blonde secretary." For one performance, HE DOESN'T KNOW I'M ALIVE was here. Steve McCall and Grace now are "old friends from Harvard and Radcliffe." Warbucks no longer eats caviar with ketchup in this scene, so that bit later on with Frances Riley is also out A lyric about Connecticut was added to THAT'S THE KIND OF WOMAN which went over well with local audiences.... The Movie House in Manhattan scene was moved from Act II to Act I, the title of the song was changed from I CAN DO NO WRONG to 'CAUSE OF YOU (essentially the same lyrics), the song was shortened, and Amanda Van Cleef/Beekman grows increasingly irritated while Warbucks and Annie lip-sync and tap dance sitting down....Grace is now in the room while Frances Riley (of Bridgeport, then Danbury, Connecticut) sings BUT YOU GO ON (previously she was out getting a fresh bottle of ketchup).... One of the biggest single changes of the while show is the real identity of Frances Riley--Miss Hannigan is out of the show entirely! Now it is Florence "Flo" Stark, sister of Commissioner Stark. Flo had already been in prison for trying to bump off an old millionaire she had married under fraudulent circumstances, and now Flo and Margie are working together to have Flo and Warbucks enjoy "five, six months of wedded bliss, then tragedy strikes -- Warbucks gets a piano dropped on his head--

or whatever, and Annie takes a long walk off a short pier." Flo and Margie still sing RICH GIRLS. For a short time in the middle of the run, RICH GIRLS was in Act II and ANYTHING FOR LOVE was here...Without Miss Hannigan trying to be selected as Mrs. Warbucks, there is no need anymore to have a substitute Annie, so the whole "Annie too/two" business is out. The entire scene of fixing up Kate Maguire is out, the song ANNIE TWO is out, kidnapping and swapping Annies is out....Grace's song HE DOESN'T KNOW I'M ALIVE was cut from Act I Scene 7 and was tried in other places but was cut again...Warbucks is leaving on a business trip to London to try to save his industries, and Annie asks to go with him....After Grace quits, Annie says, "Don't you leave me too" and instead of singing IF I WASN'T AROUND, she sings a reprise of CHANGES ("Changes, changes/here we go again/loving, leaving/now's much worse than then"). She decides to run away, now taking Sandy with her. Miss Stark barges in just as Warbucks hears from the Orphans that Annie has run away. "Are you crazy?" he yells, "The wedding is off until I find Annie!"

Act II opens with the White House communications room and a country road where Annie and Sandy are. The time Annie has been away went from six days to six weeks; at first she got as far as the Delaware Water Gap between New Jersey and Pennsylvania, but then it was changed: she hopped a freight train and ended up in Tennessee.... Many versions of this opening of Act II were tried--Warbucks, Grace, Steve, etc., singing SHE'LL BE THERE in counterpoint to Annie singing TRAVELIN' LIGHT ("Green grass/blue skies/no strings/no ties/said my goodbyes/I'm travelin' light"), then the two songs done separately....Floyd T. Walker discovers Annie working at Harvey's hot dog stand and phones Warbucks to come and get her (Floyd gets a \$100,000 reward), then Warbucks and Annie sing a reprise of CHANGES Then, it was changed to Floyd and his wife Lucy Walker bringing Annie from Tennessee to the White House; now we could see Grace's reunion with Annie as well as Warbucks'. President Roosevelt leads Annie, Grace, and his staff in a reprise of WHEN YOU SMILE before Warbucks comes back to the room and sees Annie. The CHANGES reprise was cut from here.... The opening changed again with Annie singing WHO NEEDS ME (actually TRAVELIN' LIGHT retitled--the song changed title still one more time to AIN'T LIFE GRAND; Martin Charnin made that change during the intermission of the closing performance on July 8th!). She was joined by a nameless group of poor farmers in the song. In this version Floyd T. Walker was a widower with a daugher named C.G. who couldn't believe that Annie was running away because she was getting a mother. "Are y'all crazy up there in New York?" C.G. asks Annie, "I wish $\underline{\underline{I}}$ had my momma again!" Annie realizes maybe getting a mother isn't so bad, and she sings I GUESS THINGS HAPPEN FOR THE BEST ("There's gonna be somebody else/somebody else is gonna need himshe'll love me if I let her/more love makes life much better"). (This is the third set of lyrics to this melody, which was ALL I'VE GOT IS ME in Washington and MY DADDY earlier at Goodspeed.) So Floyd and C.G. bring Annie up to the White House, still getting the reward, and still with the reprise of WHEN YOU SMILE.... In the Brooklyn Academy of Beauty, the afternoon of the selection of a wife, Flo Stark and Commissioner Stark are preparing for the party. They sing a new song in which they observe that "a man'll do ANYTHING FOR LOVE/save a dime/spend a mill/change his ways/change his will."... The selection of a wife scene in the Atrium of the Mansion is essentially the same, but now there is no fake Annie. Phyllis Wardlow, Grace's mediocre replacement as Warbucks' secretary, has been cut entirely also. Frances Riley sings THE TENEMENT LULLABY to Annie ("Isn't she precious? -- when she's asleep"), and Miss Stark subtly pressures Warbucks into selecting Mrs. Riley. Grace is somewhat suspicious seeing that Mrs. Riley happened to know Mr. Warbucks' favorite song, and she takes Frances' champagne glass to give to the FBI for a fingerprint check. Abigail Dabney is not in on the scheme, as she had been when Miss Hannigan was part of the show....The Servants sing a reprise of THAT'S THE KIND OF WOMAN about which of the contestants they thought would be selected. They are all disappointed at the selection of Frances Riley This reprise was later dropped and instead the Orphans do a reprise of THE OTHER WOMAN.... In the stateroom of the Warbucks yacht Warbucks is preparing for the wedding and both Drake and Annie are giving

him a hard time. The reprise of CHANCES was here as Warbucks tells Annie "I'm getting a wife and you're getting a mother and we're both going to have to live with it."...For almost the entire run it was Grace who discovered Frances Riley's true identity and warned Warbucks and Annie about it before the wedding ceremony began. She came into the stateroom and presented the evidence that it was really Flo Start waiting on the deck to be married. Warbucks notifies all the guests so that they know the schemer will be exposed. For a while, Warbucks was introduced to Mrs. Steve McCall while waiting for the wedding to begin. During the ceremony Warbucks feigns inattention, and Justice Brandeis pronounced them Man and Fraud! The two sisters attempt to jump overboard but are collared by Warbucks, and the parting line about "I've got something you don't have--Hair!" was here. "Did you see that?" exclaims Warbucks proudly. I'm not so old after all. You're as young as you feel, and I feel forty...two!" As he and Grace proclaim that each has secretly loved the other for years, they are oblivious to the fact that as they move closer to one another, all the Orphans are being squashed between them. When Warbucks says, "Grace, marry me!" and she pulls away a moment joking, "Gee, I don't know," all the Orphans go sprawling on the deck. Grace still just happens to have had a marriage blood test yesterday ("A girl's always got to be prepared") and the yacht's horn obscures the ceremony except for the words "I do." WHEN YOU SMILE is begun by the chorus as underscoring under the last few lines of dialogue.... At the end of the run there were further big changes in the last two scenes: Peaches and Molly, playing hideand-seek, happen to overhear the two Stark sisters discussing their plot right after Frances Riley has been selected. Since she has been reading detective magazines, Peaches investigates and takes the champagne glass, and it is she who notifies Annie and President Roosevelt. But nothing is revealed at this point, so when the wedding ceremony starts, everyone, including Warbucks, is still under the impression that Frances Riley is who she says she is. Grace attends, "for Annie's sake" only. The captain of the yacht interrupts the vows with a radiogram that says the London office is ruined and Warbucks is now broke. Of course, now Frances Riley no longer wants to marry him. So the President reads the FBI report exposing the two sisters. The same proposal scene follows, with the addition of Grace saying, "I don't care if we are poor; we can move to Hell's Kitchen and live on love!" Annie gives "Daddy" a wedding president-telling him the radiogram was a phony, cooked up by the President to trap Frances Riley. During the WHEN YOU SMILE reprise, Sandy stands on his hind legs and dances with Drake and Mrs. Pugh....


Jennifer, 11, models the "2" T-shirt given to each member of the cast. She is from Boston and has played both Molly and Annie locally.

Lauren and Chelsea arrive together at the theater for a Saturday matinee.




